

This factsheet presents all age data on injury deaths and injury hospitalisations by numbers, rates, the three leading causes, gender, ethnicity and place where the injury death occurred. The data for injury deaths were sourced via the Injury Prevention Research Unit (IPRU) from the New Zealand Health Information Service (NZHIS) for the year 2003 (the most recent year for which injury death data was available). The data for injury hospitalisations were sourced via the IPRU from the NZHIS for the year 2005 (the most recent year for which injury hospitalisation data were available).

INJURY DEATHS:

- ⇒ During 2005, 5 people from Carterton died as a result of an injury.
- ⇒ Suffocation and Motor Vehicle Traffic were the leading causes of injury death.

- ⇒ During 2005, 100 people from Carterton were hospitalised overnight for treatment of an injury.
- ⇒ Falls were the leading cause of injury hospitalisations (n= 38).
