Workplace Injuries and Prevention:

General Facts and Figures:

- In 2014, there were 46 fatalities and 3504 serious harm notifications in the workplace.
- WorkSafe NZ was created by the Government in 2013 as a regulatory agency dedicated to improving workplace health and safety by achieving a 25% reduction in workplace deaths and serious harm by 2025.
- Agriculture, Forestry, Construction, Manufacturing and High-risk commercial fishing are considered to be the highest risk industry sectors; with one in five workers reporting they had experienced a serious harm incident in the last 12 months (Health and Safety Attitudes and Behaviours Survey, Work Safe 2014).
- In 2013/14 ACC accepted 186,696 new claims for workplace injuries (2013/14 total \$1.8 million new claims).
- In March 2014 the Government introduced the Health and Safety Reform Bill representing significant change to New Zealand's health and safety system that puts more onus and legal requirements on employers to manage risks and keep their workers safe, requires greater participation of workers in workplace health and safety and establishes greater penalties for unsafe working practices.
